University Open Day Checklist

Before the Day

- Register/book a place
- Check the event timetable and highlight sessions you want to attend
- Prepare a list of questions (course, accommodation, support, social life)
- Arrange travel and accommodation (if needed)
- Pack essentials:
 - A bag to carry freebies!
 - Notebook & pen
 - o Phone/camera & charger
 - Comfortable shoes & weather-appropriate clothing

On the Day

Campus & Facilities

- Take a guided or self-guided campus tour
- Visit your subjects facilities, library, IT facilities, and study spaces
- Check sports and leisure facilities
- Explore social spaces, cafés, and student union

Accommodation

- View at least one type of accommodation
- Ask about costs, contracts, bills included, and internet access
- Check safety, location, and distance from campus/town
- Ask if you can live with friends or return after first year

Course & Teaching

Attend subject talk(s) or taster sessions

- Ask about:
 - Course structure and optional modules
 - Assessments (exams vs coursework)
 - Placement or work experience opportunities
 - Industry/professional links
 - Typical class sizes and contact hours

Student Support & Life

- Speak to current students about their experience
- Ask about:
 - Academic support (tutors, mentoring)
 - Disability and mental health support
 - Careers and employability services
 - o Student societies, clubs, volunteering
 - o Transport links to local area

After the Day - REFLECT

- Note first impressions (atmosphere, friendliness, facilities)
- Write down what you liked/disliked
- Make a pros & cons list for each university
- Consider how you will travel to and from university
- Follow up with admissions staff if you have unanswered questions
- Compare with other universities you visit
- Talk to Mrs Southern to decide if university or an apprenticeship is for you. If you have questions about your university application please speak to your UCAS adviser
