LEADERSHIP WITH VISION AND VALUES

Leadership at Kimbolton was praised for its clarity of purpose, moral strength and commitment to pupil wellbeing. Inspectors found that leaders work collaboratively and reflectively, seeking the views of pupils, staff and parents to inform decision-making. The school's refreshed values — Courage, Curiosity, Endeavour, Integrity and Kindness — are meaningfully embedded across curriculum, pastoral care, co-curricular activities and long-term planning. The report confirms that decisions are consistently made "in the best interests of pupils" and that leaders have a clear vision for the school's future development.


Governance

GUIDED BY EXPERIENCE AND INSIGHT

Governors were commended for their high-quality oversight, strategic clarity and meaningful engagement with school life. They bring a wide range of professional expertise and work closely with the Headmaster and senior leaders to ensure that the Standards are consistently met. Their committee structure, regular visits, policy reviews and constructive challenge ensure accountability and ambition. The Board also oversees safeguarding, risk, finance and long-term strategy — including the development of the new Pre-School.

Teaching, curriculum and learning

AMBITIOUS TEACHING, INSPIRED LEARNERS

Inspectors found that pupils enjoy a broad, well-planned and inclusive curriculum that encourages creativity, independence and intellectual curiosity. Teaching is ambitious, imaginative and engaging. Subject specialists provide strong academic challenge across the school, while SEND and EAL provision is well targeted and diagnostic. Assessment systems are purposeful and ensure pupils make strong progress. Pupils achieve high-quality qualifications and go on to appropriate post-18 destinations.

Co-curricular and enrichment

EDUCATION BEYOND THE CLASSROOM

Kimbolton's co-curricular programme was described as extensive and highly valued. Pupils benefit from numerous opportunities in sport, drama, music, art, outdoor education, CCF, Duke of Edinburgh and academic societies. These experiences cultivate leadership, resilience, teamwork and creativity. The house system enhances community life and provides additional opportunities for competition, participation and collaboration. Boarding enriches this further through weekend activities and shared routines that build independence.

- Leadership opportunities through clubs and the house system.
- CCF and Duke of Edinburgh open to all.

Wellbeing, mental health & PSHE

A COMMUNITY WHERE EVERY CHILD IS KNOWN AND SUPPORTED

Inspectors found a warm and supportive ethos where pupils feel safe, valued and able to seek help when needed. The school's wellbeing hubs provide early intervention, while the PSHE and RSE curriculum promotes respect, empathy, consent, digital resilience and personal development. Behaviour in the Prep School and Sixth Form was seen as strong.

KEY POINTS:

- Wellbeing hubs support early intervention.
- PSHE and RSE curriculum broad and age-appropriate.
- Positive, empathetic relationships modelled throughout the school.
- Behaviour strong across most year groups.
- Early Years strengthens self-regulation and communication.

Physical health, PE and boarding wellbeing

HEALTHY PUPILS, CONFIDENT BOARDERS

Physical education and sport feature strongly across the curriculum, promoting fitness, teamwork and resilience. Pupils enjoy opportunities in a wide range of sports, outdoor learning and active play. Boarding provides a homely, supervised and inclusive environment where pupils develop independence through daily routines and shared responsibilities. Pupils told inspectors they feel safe and supported, and that boarding enhances their confidence and social skills.

KEY POINTS:

- Strong PE, sport and outdoor activity provision.
- Healthy routines and opportunities for physical development.
- Boarding environment "warm and inclusive."
- · Accommodation well maintained and safe.
- Routines build independence and self-sufficiency.
- Pupils feel safe and supported in boarding.

Contribution to society

PUPILS WHO MAKE A DIFFERENCE

Inspectors praised the strong culture of service, leadership and social responsibility at Kimbolton. Pupils take part in meaningful volunteering, charitable fundraising and community engagement. Through RE, chapel, assemblies and tutor time, pupils explore moral and social issues and learn to respect different viewpoints. Careers education is personalised, well-structured and prepares pupils well for future pathways. Economic education begins in Prep, giving pupils early experience of enterprise, budgeting and money management.

- Strong moral, social and religious education.
- Environmental action and community partnerships.
- Well-developed careers programme.
- Early economic education in Prep.


Safeguarding

A CULTURE OF VIGILANCE AND CARE

Safeguarding at Kimbolton was found to be effectively managed, with strong systems for training, safer recruitment and risk assessment. The inspection identified a single administrative omission in the safeguarding policy on Day 1, which was corrected immediately during the visit. Inspectors confirmed that pupils feel safe and know how to seek support, and that staff understand how to report concerns. Leaders and governors work closely with external agencies and monitor systems robustly. Online safety, boarding safeguarding and pastoral structures were all highlighted as strengths.

- Safeguarding effectively managed.
- Administrative policy omission corrected during inspection.
- · Strong staff training and reporting culture.
- SCR and safer recruitment robust.
- Boarding safeguarding thorough and proactive.
- Pupils taught how to stay safe online and offline.
