Expectations

ALL PUPILS MUST:

1. Show respect for others, in school, out of school and online.
2. Follow staff and prefect instructions promptly and politely.
3. Attend all lessons and registered activities punctually.
4. Work conscientiously in class and complete work to the best of their ability.
5. Engage positively in extra-curricular activities.

Rules

BOUNDS

Pupils must keep to paths within the school grounds. Ball games are allowed only on the Mall, between the rows of trees. The following areas are out of bounds: West Lawn, Upper Portico, Pellegrini Staircase, and all school ponds unless in a supervised activity. Only Sixth Form pupils may visit the High Street during the school day. Pupils may use the Mall and areas around classroom buildings only.

PROHIBITED ITEMS

The following must not be brought onto school premises: alcohol, vaping equipment, cigarettes, non-prescribed drugs, solvents, offensive weapons.

MOBILE PHONES

Phones must be switched off on arrival and remain off all day. Sixth Form pupils may use phones in the Sixth Form Centre or Castle Courtyard, and in lessons with teacher permission.

PERSONAL POSSESSIONS

Pupils should not bring valuables or large sums of money to school.

EATING AND DRINKING

No eating or drinking (except water) is permitted in lessons. Food must remain in the dining room. Litter must be placed in bins.

TRANSPORT

Licensed drivers may park at school with the Headmaster's permission and must follow regulations. Seat belts must be worn in school minibuses.

PERSONAL BEHAVIOUR

Bullying, fighting, offensive language, public displays of affection, play-fighting, jostling and horseplay are not permitted.

Uniform rules

First to Fifth Forms

1. Clothing and shoes are clean, in good order and correctly worn.
2. Hair must be neat and of a natural colour. Blazers must be worn at all times around school.
3. Shirts and blouses must be tucked in at all times.
4. Black school shoes only (no trainers). Black or dark grey socks if in trousers.
5. In winter, plain black, grey or blazer-purple gloves may be worn. Dark grey, black or navy coats.

GIRLS

- ♦ No make-up or nail varnish in First and Second Form. From Third Form, make-up must be discreet. Clear nail varnish may be worn.
- ♦ Jewellery: One bracelet may be worn. No rings. No facial piercings. Necklace allowed if small, plain symbol of world religions on a thin chain. One plain gold, silver or small pearl/diamante stud in each ear lobe may be worn. Jewellery cannot be worn during Games.
- ♦ In First and Second Form, long hair is to be tied back. Simple hairband only. No ribbons or scrunchies.

BOYS

- ♦ Must be clean shaven, no make-up, no jewellery. Hair must be above ears and collar.
- ♦ Belts must be plain black leather with plain buckle.

Sixth Form

ALL RULES AS ABOVE EXCEPT:

- ♦ Business dress instead of school blazers
- ♦ Girls' shirts, if fitted in style, may be untucked
- ♦ Girls: Can have two earrings per ear. Can wear jewellery suitable for a business environment.
- ♦ Boys: Plain black or school tie in L6; colour of choice in U6.
- ♦ U6 students may scarves in a colour of their choice; L6: white, black, grey or purple scarves.
