A Careers Fair is held in school to help you understand different job roles and industries. You can also find out what skills and pathways to access them.

There will be over 40 universities, employers, and OK's all available to give you information and answer your questions.

- 1st-3rd form will come to the event P5 and P6.
- 4th-U6th will come to the event in the evening 6-8pm with your family

It is a busy event!

But there will be a quiet session between 5.15-6pm and if you want to access that please let your tutor know. This is for any year group.



Why bother going to the fair?

You can:

- **Find out more about the different post 18 options** that are available to you and what you need to do to access them.
- **Gather Information about university/apprenticeships** – Learn about courses, entry requirements, and career pathways.
- **Find out about different jobs and the reality of them – Consider if they match your current understanding.**
- **Motivate yourself** to see how your education fits into your future
- **Plan Next Steps** – Collecting brochures, information and research tools



How does preparing now help you?



You can gain a lot of information for your next steps, but it is important ask the right questions, speak to the right people and find out the answers you need to help you!

Check your understanding while you are at the fair....

Do you really know the difference between a solicitor and a judge? We have both at the careers fair!

Do you understand the difference between marketing and PR? Ask our local employers!

What is the difference between art and graphics? Find out from our local graphic designer!

What is an independent estate agent? What is the difference between an estate agent and property management



▲ Careers Fair Prompt Sheet

Ask questions, listen carefully, and write down key information. There are no right or wrong answers – this is about learning and exploring.

Questions you can ask the job/company exhibitors are:

1. What the Job / Industry Involves

- What do you do every day?
- What is the most interesting part of your job?
- What is challenging about it?

2. Skills and Qualities Needed

- What skills do I need now at school?
- What makes someone good at this job?
- Are there any skills that can help in lots of jobs?

3. Education and Training Pathways

- What subjects should I focus on?
- Do I need to go to university?
- Are there other ways into this career?

4. Opportunities and Labour Market Trends (LMI)


- Will there be jobs like this in the future?
- What are other jobs in this sector?
- Can people change their role later?

5. Real-Life Experiences

- What is the hardest part of your job?
- What do you enjoy most?
- What surprised you when you started?

6. Advice for Pupils

- What can I do now to help me later?
- Are there clubs or activities that help?
- How can I find out more?



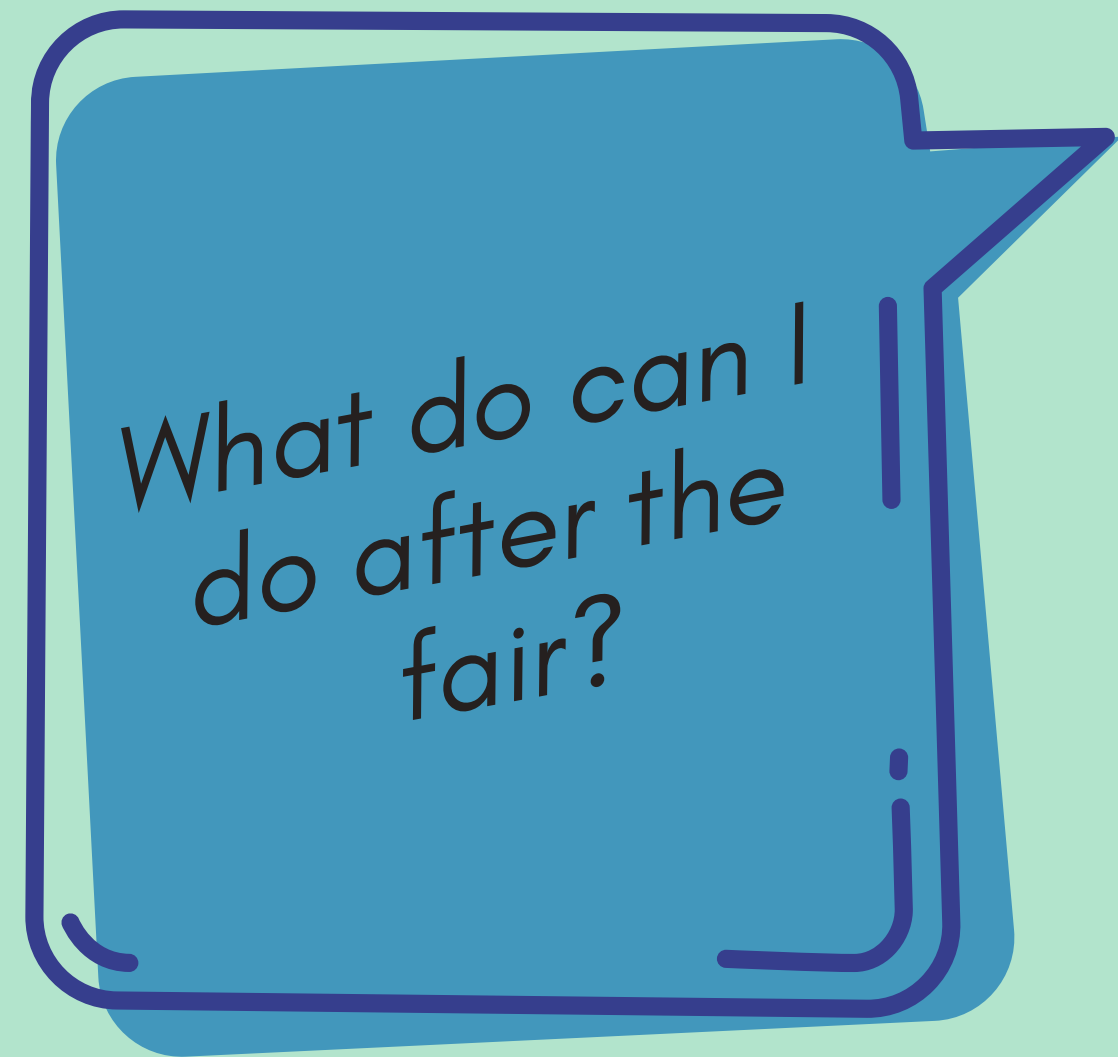

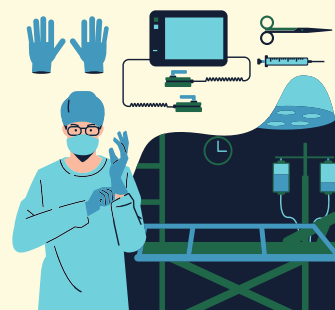
